#### **Administrative Provisions**

- Includes requested language for Tribal Cooperative Agreements, identical to language included in the past.
- Continues prohibition on promulgation of Tolerance Fee Rule.
- Extends Maintenance Fees until 9/30/04 and allows Agency to collect upt o \$21.5 million, identical language to FY03.
- Prohibits collection of Registration fees, while collecting maintenance fee.
- Permanent technical fix to Brownfields authorization on purchasers, regardless of date purchases.
- One year technical fix to Brownfields authorization to allow Administrative costs from grants, as deemed by the Administrator.
- Amends Clean Air Act to prohibit California from setting standards for small engines.
