Evi – my apologies for my delayed response. The answers to both your questions are NO.

More specifically, for non-aquaculture-related violations to transport permits we are not required to notify the State Veterinarian, although as a matter of courtesy we may include Dr. Joseph in our notification. I have not notified anyone concerning this specific violation.

I have kept confidential your scientific integrity complaint documents. However, as I am sure you know, Joy Evered works for both WDFW and WFRC, so you would need to ask her directly if she has discussed/shared the complaint documents with anyone else at WFRC.

I do not expect that we will impose any penalties associated with this violation to your transport permit. However, after consulting with the WDFW's Director and Fish Program Assistant Director, and co-managers, we may impose a moratorium of future transport permits associated with fish being transported to WFRC until the situation described in your Scientific Integrity Complaint for Incident #2 is resolved.

Lastly, there is no need to include Joan Thomas in these communications.
